re you looking for new pot plant materials to offer to

your customers? There are innumerable species from which to choose, but which crop is the most profitable to grow? I doubt if anyone can honestly answer that question. It boils down to knowing your customers. Do your customers ask and look for new and/or reintroduced plant material?
