

Anon. 1975, Cheap Kenyon Imports: Crucial Issue. *The Grower*. 84:827.

Producers of the country's 170 acres of carnations are not relaxing their fight against cheap imports. The crucial item is the position over Kenyon carnations which are being imported from a huge complex set up in that country by the Danish DCK company. The Kenyan empire is complete with its own airport,

township and growing area. Carnations are reaching this country at 8.8¢ against the home growers' 17.6¢ needed to cover costs and show a small return on investment.

In recent lobbying, growers made very clear that unless action is taken, present acreage may well drop to 60 within two years. Like the rest of the glasshouse producers, growers face a possible 10% increase in the price of oil and equal pay for women.
