Highlight Suggestions for Handling Annual Seedlings

- 1. Annual flower seedlings germinate best at 65-70°F.
- 2. Watch moisture levels, particularly for seedlings grown in plastic pots and packs. Have adequate drainage.
 - 3. If damp-off occurs, use one of the following methods:
 - a. Dust method mix Thiram (disulfide)(Arasan) half and half with fine sand and dust over young germinating seedlings. Use a plastic top shaker. Then water in lightly.
 - b. Morton's Soil Drench a mercury material used at rate of one fluid ounce per 35 gallons of water. See FLOROGRAM for last month for other methods.
- 4. Make several successive sowings of seeds so that seedlings do not get too large for effective transplanting.
- 5. Sow seedlings in rows regardless of size of seed to reduce spread of damp-off organisms.
