

# Lower Temperatures Save Fuel

The following figures were based on work done by engineers at Rutgers University. M. R. Harrison, Extension floriculturist at Rutgers, has prepared the simplified table:

Average monthly outside temperature, 20°:

If you cut 65 to 60°, you save 11 percent.

Cut 65 to 55°, you save 22 percent.

Cut 65 to 50°, you save 33 percent.

Average monthly outside temperature of 32°:

If you cut 65 to 60°, you save 15 percent.

Cut 65 to 55°, you save 30 percent.

Cut 65 to 50°, you save 45 percent.

Outside temperature, 40°:

If you cut 65 to 60°, you save 20 percent.

Cut 65 to 55°, you save 40 percent.

Outside temperature, 48°:

If you cut 65 to 60°, you save 29 percent.

Cut 65 to 55°, you save 58 percent.
